## Grace Alcaide Janicas

Grace was born in Portugal and raised in Toronto's Parkdale neighbourhood. She attended the University of Toronto and Osgoode Hall Law School from which she graduated in 1992. She was called to the Bar in February of 1994, moved to Sudbury shortly after and has been a member of the Sudbury District Law Association since. Over the years, she has practiced in several areas of law, including: criminal law – both as a defence lawyer and prosecutor; disability law; social assistance and housing law; administrative law and civil litigation. She has also argued Charter and human rights issues at many different levels of tribunal and court. Grace has appeared before the Ontario Court of Justice, the Superior Court of Justice, the Divisional Court, the Pension Appeals Board, the Ontario Court of Appeal and the Supreme Court of Canada. She was a founding member of the *Justice With Dignity* campaign which advocated for a Coroner's Inquest into the death of Kimberly Rogers and for the repeal of social assistance laws that contributed to Ms Rogers' death. She is a long-standing Member of the Board of the Social Planning Council of Sudbury and the Sudbury District Restorative Justice Board. She is also a member of the Pioneer Manor Ethics Committee and a founding Director of the Sudbury Unlimited eNergy Cooperative (SUN Co-op). Currently, Grace is a staff lawyer with the Sudbury Community Legal Clinic, practicing mainly in the areas of disability, social assistance and housing law. She proudly feels like "the luckiest mommy in the whole wild world" because of her two wonderful sons Ben and Josué Kurke, (and a puppy named Tux who thinks he's a boy).
